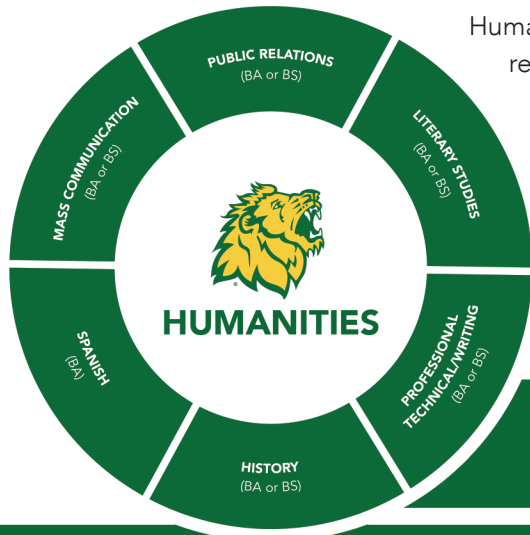


META MAJORS HUMANITIES PATHWAY

The first year of the Humanities meta major pathway provides broad foundational instruction in Communication, English, History, and Spanish, which will support your pursuit of any of those majors.

- **Influence:** Leverage the power of your writing to inform and persuade audiences both professionally and personally.
- **Connection:** Leverage the power of print, broadcast, radio, social media, the Internet, and new emergent technologies that are growing and developing right alongside you.

ENGLISH

- **Writing:** Writing effectively for various audiences and purposes is personally fulfilling and written communication is among the most in-demand job skills.
- **Perspectives:** Training in English gives weight to multiple perspectives. The ability to think otherwise is a cornerstone of a good and meaningful life.

HISTORY

- **Complexity:** Delve into the societies of other times and places by weighing varying accounts of past events in order to create a meaningful and reliable interpretation of what happened.
